2026 - 2027 Determination of Homelessness
Federal Student Aid Programs

On your 2026-2027 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), you indicated that you were unaccompanied and either homeless or at risk of being homeless at some point on or after July 1, 2025. In order to meet the federal definition of being homeless for financial aid purposes, students must be **BOTH** unaccompanied **AND** lacking fixed and adequate housing. These two requirements are defined as:

- (1) **Unaccompanied** means you are not living in the physical custody of your parent or guardian and can not get in contact with them.
- (2) **Homeless** means lacking fixed, regular and adequate housing. You may be homeless if you are living in shelters, parks, motels, cars, or other public places or are temporarily living with other people because you have nowhere else to go. If you are living in any of these situations and fleeing an abusive or unsafe environment, you may be considered homeless even if your parent would provide support and a place to live.

PLEASE NOTE: A homeless determination **MUST NOT** be used (1) to make an otherwise ineligible student eligible for federal aid; 2) if your parent(s) are unwilling to provide financial data or support; 3) if you are self-supporting; or, 4) if your parents do not claim you on their income tax returns, or contribute towards your educational expenses.
